Charles Specht, Iroquois Central School District Board Member

Mr. Specht is a 1974 graduate of Iroquois Central High School. He chose to run for the board and was first elected to the Iroquois Central School Board in 2009. He has served as both President and Vice President of the Board of Education.

At ECASB, he has served as the Vice President as well as the President of the organization. He has always been active with the Legislative Team and has participated as an active member on the Delegate Assembly team and the Budget and Finance Team. Mr. Specht is the recipient of the ECASB Laura Burns Advocacy for Children Award as well as the recipient of the Rising Star and Shining Star Awards. He has also been the recipient of several New York State School Board Achievement Awards over the years.

Mr. Specht graduated from St. Bonaventure University in 1978 with a degree in Business Administration. After graduation, he worked for Resser Management Company before joining the Fiduciary Tax Department at HSBC Bank where he was the Vice-President of Operations in the Investment Management Division until 1991 when he left to become business and office manager for a family owned business.
