Dr. Hank Stopinski has served in the role of Superintendent of the Depew UFSD for 1.5 years. In the brief time he has been at Depew, he feels that his greatest accomplishment is the creation of a framework for a strategic plan with goals around student wellness and supports, inclusion and belonging, school safety, improve academic performance and the development of CTE opportunities for all students. His beginnings started at Granville Central High School where he served as a Science teacher. He then served as a Director of Career and Technical Education at both the River Valley Technical Center and Capital Region BOCES. Founding Principal of the Health Sciences Center, Dr. Stopinski moved to the Roy Hart CSD where he served as Superintendent before moving to the Depew UFSD. In retirement, Dr. Stopinski plans to devote quality time with his wife and family, get to all the projects that are on his "to do" list, spend time in the outdoors and garden, and entertain opportunities to help our public school systems and other service organizations.

Dr. Stopinski is a graduate of Williamsville North High School where some of his fondest memories of school are the times spent with fellow athletes and coaches. He also remembers the passion teachers exhibited for education like his Latin teacher, Miss Leone, who inspired him and his classmates to love learning.

He was recognized as a National Teacher of the year, Vermont State Principal of the Year, Basketball Coach of the Year, church and scouting leadership awards. Dr. Stopinski attended Niagara County Community College and Forest Technology, S.U.N.Y. C.E.S &F, in Wanakena for his Associates Degree. He earned a Bachelor of Science and a Bachelor or Arts in Secondary Education/Natural Science from Castleton State College in Castleton, Vermont. His Master Degree in Educational Administration and Leadership was earned from Castleton State College as well. Dr. Stopinski earned his Educational Leadership Ed.D. from NOVA Southeaster University, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida. His dissertation was, Development of a Career Academy Evaluation Model for Rural Schools.
