Senator Kennedy is a graduate of St. Joseph's Collegiate Institute and D'Youville College where he possess both a Bachelor's & Master's Degree in Occupational Therapy.

After being named chair of the Transportation Committee, Senator Kennedy brought \$100 million to the Niagara Transportation Authority to fund a 5 year capital project for the Metro Rail in Buffalo. He has sponsored legislation to install cameras on school buses to help protect the safety of children. In addition, he sponsored Jay-J's Law and Jackie's Law. Jay-J's Law stiffens penalties for child abusers, while Jackie's Law protects the victims of domestic violence by preventing GPS stalking.

Tim led the call for \$5 million to the Buffalo Billion for funding for reuse and restructuring for the Central Terminal on the East Side of Buffalo.

Senator Kennedy sponsors "Kennedy Jobs File" on his website which posts jobs in the Western New York region in hopes of improving economic conditions in his home town.
