<u>ECASB ANNUAL DINNER</u>: Will again be held at Kloc's Grove in West Seneca on June 12th. Registration forms and information will be sent out next week. When I contacted Kevin at Kloc's he informed me that the prices remained the same from last year, hence we will be able to keep the same pricing as last years dinner. That was a pleasant surprise!

J.P. MORGAN CORPORATE CHALLENGE IS JUNE 12TH. It came to our attention that the J.P. Morgan Corporate Challenge happens to be on June 12th, which is the same date as the ECASB Annual Dinner. ECASB reached out to J.P. Morgan to find out if they have a set date each year for the corporate challenge to see if we can avoid it in the future. ECASB establishes their calendar in February/March of the previous year. The 2025 Annual ECASB Dinner was set back in March of 2024. The corporate challenge in Buffalo was announced in January/February 2025. The Buffalo corporate challenge is usually scheduled 2 weeks after the New York City corporate challenge. ECASB has traditionally scheduled the annual dinner the 2nd Thursday of June. Thursdays have been selected for ECASB events as it is the night of the week with the least number of districts having Board of Education meetings. <u>NATIONAL SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION ANNOUNCES INDOOR AIR QUALITY GRANT APPLI-</u> <u>CATION</u>: NSBA has partnered with Go Green Initiative on an EPA funded program to improve air quality and reduce gas emissions in low-income and Tribal school districts. Each year 10 schools will be chosen to receive on-the-ground technical assistance and \$50,000 in grand funding to enact Indoor Air Quality Management plans. To qualify, districts must serve a population of 50% or more who qualify for free and reduced-price lunch or reside in a Tribal community. Deadline for submission of the application is May 15, 2025. **EDUCATION RELATED BUDGET ITEMS**: State budget runs were available on Thursday. Below are

highlights that have been released related to the budget:

- Full funding of Foundation Aid.
- Minimum 2% Foundation Aid increase for all school districts.
- Universal free school breakfast and lunch.
- Increase to the BOCES aidable salary cap will move from \$30,000 to \$60,000 in 2028-2029.
- Foundation Aid formula changes to student poverty/need factors.
- Foundation Aid formula increases to assist English language learners
- Foundation Aid formula change to increase English language learner weighting from .50 to .53
