Special Thank you to Superintendent Dr. Timothy Oldenburg, and District Clerk Michelle Moore. Assistant Superintendent Mary Beth Scullion, and the Director of Pupil Personnel organized and provided us pointers on our "cupcake war competition" - so thank you. I was provided with a Tonawanda City SD apron with the phrase "Tonawanda Leadership Teamwork - Coming Together is the Beginning, Keeping Together is Progress, and Working Together is Success". With these ingredients - Tonawanda City School District is on the path to greatness.

BUFFALO BOARD OF EDUCATION: Was where I spent my Wednesday night, November 15th. The meeting was held at the Arthur O. Eve School of Distinction #61 at 453 Leroy Avenue. I spent probably about 45 minutes in the hallways before the meeting looking at all of the student artwork and writings - it was very impressive. Prior to the meeting a student group of 4th grade students did an outstanding rendition of a Michael Jackson song on their sting instruments. During the meeting, the Board spend quite a bit of time revieing data related to student performance.

NYSSBA INVITES YOU TO TAKE ACTION:

- Urge Governor Hochul to <u>support and sign S.1045/A.1567</u> which would make technical adjustments to property tax cap law by incorporating as part of the "tax base growth factor" the value of new property on the exempt side of the tax rolls due to a payment in lieu of taxes.
- Urge Governor Hochul to <u>veto S.1039/A3748-A</u> which would establish disciplinary process for permanent civil service employees that is similar to that which districts currently required to engage in when dealing with tenured instructional staff.

BLUE RIBBON COMMISION RELEASED RCOMMENDATIONS ON GRADUATION MEASURES: Eliminate three current types of diplomas (Regents, Regents with Advance Designation, and Local) to be replaced with one diploma that will have options of seals and endorsements. Also a recommendation of instead of having students pass four of five Regents exams, students will take performance based assessments. Specifically:

- Reduce and/or modify diploma assessment requirements to allow more assessment options.
- Create state developed rubrics for any performance based assessments.
- Create more specific, tailored graduation requirements to address the unique circumstances of certain groups of students.

Much work would yet need to be done regarding the implementation. One of the recommendations calls for the Regents to review and revise the New York State learning standards. Additionally, the following recommendations were made by the commission:

- Include civic responsibility, cultural competence, financial literacy education, fine and performing arts, science, technology, engineering and mathematics credits, writing, and writing skills.
- Ensure access to CTE including internships and work-based learning opportunities for all students
 - Move to model and organize credit requirement.
- Provide exemptions from diploma assessment requirements for students with significant cognitive disabilities and major life events and extenuating circumstances.
- Require all New York State teacher prep programs to provide instruction in culturally responsive sustaining education practices and pedagogy.
- Pursue regulatory changes to allow the discretion to confer high school degrees posthumously.
