SUPPORT PROPOSITION 1: When voting this upcoming election day, please support Proposition 1. Currently Small City School Districts are restricted to 5% debt limit compared to all other school districts in New York state, where the debt limit is 10%. Small City School districts cannot accomplish construction projects in the same manner that most school districts can. Improvements are often delayed and districts are placed in a higher financial burden. This legislation would affect two of ECASB members including Lackawanna City School District and Tonawanda City School District.

<u>TIER 6 VERSUS TIER 4</u>: There has been discussion from NYSUT about fixing Tier 6. The Legislative Committee has discussed Tier 6 briefly. Here are a few comparisons:

<u>Tier 4</u> <u>Tier 6</u>

Payments end after 10 years/capped at 3% At \$46,000 - pays 3.5%

At \$56,000 - pays 4.5% At \$76,000 - pays 5.75% At \$101,000 - pays 6%

Can retire at age 55 with 30 years penalty free At age 63, they can retire penalty free

* A teacher that is in Tier 6 may work an extra 8 years so that they can collect their pension penalty free. An employee that may have left at age 55 may now be working for 8 more years at top step - thus costing the district more in salary, and health benefits as they age. The plus side for the district is they may not have to replace the teacher amongst a teaching shortage. The downside is that the district will be paying a much higher salary and incurring extra health care costs. A Tier 6 employee paying a higher percentage for the length of their career than their Tier 4 counterparts may encourage teachers to make career changes thus worsening the teacher shortage.

- If a Tier 4 member retires at age 55 with 30 years service, they would receive 60% of final average salary.
- If a Tier 6 member retires at age 55 with 30 years service, they would receive 26.4% of final average salary, compared to a Tier 4, who would receive 60% of their final average salary.

DID YOU KNOW:

- Less than 1% of NYSTRS members are in Tiers 1,2, and 3
- 59% of NYSTRS members are in Tier 4
- 4% of NYSTRS members are in Tier 5
- 36% of NYSTRS members are in Tier 6
