Time to Take Action

During the summer months, take some time to learn about advocacy in your district. What specific needs does your district have and how can you play a part in helping advocate for those needs?

One way is to get involved with your district and your board to write a resolution for NYSSBA. The NYSSBA Resolution Kit was emailed out this past week, and copies are on file here at ECASB. All resolutions and proposed bylaw amendments must be received at NYSSBA by 5 p.m. on July 12, 2024. Sample resolutions and advice on writing one are all included in the kit published by NYSSBA. I would love to see some resolutions from ECASB component districts! Let me know if I can help in any way. On another note, it is possible for several boards to sign on to a single resolution, and I would be happy to coordinate such a venture.

Also during the summer months, take some time to visit with legislators. Invite them to summer events in your district. Use this time to give them a "quiet" tour of the building and grounds, especially if legislators want to see the impact legislation has on school environment issues and building aid.

Again, I am happy to facilitate arranging meetings, and I would even join you if I am available.

BILL ALERT

New Bills:

<u>S09092 (teaching training)</u> - Requires continuing teacher and leader education to include courses, programs and activities related to immigrant focused trauma-informed practices to support students who are dealing with adverse childhood or adolescent experiences as a result of immigration status. There are no local sponsors on this bill introduced on April 22, 2024.

<u>A09849 (Annual Performance Review)</u> -Relates to annual professional performance reviews of teachers and principals; establishes an optional system of annual professional performance review plans; repeals provisions relating to streamlined removal procedures for teachers rated ineffective. Co-Sponsored by Bill Conrad, this bill was introduced on April 12, 2024. Additionally, companion bill <u>S09054</u> has advanced to the third reading. This one is gaining some traction.

<u>A04605/S01750 (Literacy)</u> - Establishes the state financial literacy fund which provides funding for project grants to organizations in order to establish financial capability and financial literacy programs, products, content, and/or services for at-risk populations in New York. There are no local sponsors in either house.

<u>*S09018* (Student Board Members)</u> - Allows for the designation of students as ex officio members of school boards; clarifies what such ex officio members are permitted to do. There are no local sponsors.

<u>*A09760* (BOCES Naming)</u> - Renames boards of cooperative educational services to "NY Polytechnical Institutes. There are no local sponsors.

Delivered to the Governor:

<u>A08804/S08300 (Capital Project Budget)</u> - Makes appropriations for the support of government - Capital Projects Budget.

<u>Signed by the Governor:</u>

<u>S08306 (State Budget)</u> - Enacts into law major components of legislation necessary to implement the state education, labor, housing and family assistance budget for the 2024-2025 state fiscal year. This bill does include money to study foundation aid and restores the safe harmless funds.
