NYSSBA'S 2024 LEADERSHIP IN EDUCATION EVENT: To be held July 19th and 20th at the Crown Plaza Albany at the The Desmond Hotel has announced registration is now open. One of the featured sessions will be on Al. Other sessions include many of the issues you are facing such as: Declining Enrollment, New Pathways for Future-Ready Students; Chronic Absenteeism, Current NYSED Initiatives, Navigating Board Conflict, Teacher Shortages, and Supporting Academic Achievement for All.
